Idaho National Role Model

Kindred Nursing and Rehabilitation Center — Mountain Valley (now Mountain Valley of Cascadia), health care, 2016

Success Story

Providing hope and promoting healing and recovery: that is the mission of Kindred Nursing and Rehabilitation Center—Mountain Valley, a 68-bed skilled nursing center in Kellogg, Idaho, a rural community set in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains. Kindred—Mountain Valley provides short-term and long-term skilled nursing and rehabilitation services. The center has 92 employees and reports a total net revenue of \$6.4 million.

Selected Results

- For 7 years, 5-Star (top) quality rating from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (achieved by less than 1% of 15,600 skilled nursing facilities nationwide)
- 100% of residents and family members expressing either "very" or "extreme" overall satisfaction levels, better than national averages by 20% for residents and 10% for families
- 90% employee retention rate, more than 20% above the national industry average
- 89–90% occupancy rate, better than state and national benchmarks

Baldrige in the U.S.

- U.S. organizations applying for the Baldrige Award have received 1,767 feedback reports detailing organizational strengths and opportunities for improvement.
- 124 Baldrige Award recipients share their role-model practices with other organizations.
- 2010–2020 applicants represent 676,535 U.S. jobs, 5,001 work sites, more than \$189 billion in revenues/budgets, and about 614 million customers served.
- 253 national Baldrige examiners volunteered roughly \$5.7 million in services in 2020.
- In 2019, 29 independently funded and managed regional, state, and sector Baldrige-based programs evaluated 1,598 organizations using 1,686 volunteer examiners.
