- 6 Washington applicants for the Baldrige Award (2005–2020)
- 2 Washington award applicants in 2011 represent 6,948 jobs, 92 work locations, \$1 billion in revenues/budgets, and 1.7 million customers served.

Performance Excellence Northwest

The Alliance for Performance Excellence (www.BaldrigeAlliance.org) is a nonprofit national network of Baldrige-based organizations with a mission to grow performance excellence in support of a thriving Baldrige community. Alliance members include Baldrige-based programs that use the Baldrige Excellence Framework to serve organizations from all sectors in their region, state, or a specific industry. These programs annually evaluate and recognize over 1,000 organizations and serve as the feeder system for the national Baldrige Award.

Performance Excellence Northwest (PENNW; https://performanceexcellencenw.org) is a regional program affiliated with the national Baldrige Performance Excellence Program. Volunteers comprise the Board of Directors, Panel of Judges, Board of Examiners, Mentors and others. Our 200+ volunteers partner with health care organizations, manufacturers, government agencies, schools, small and large businesses and nonprofits to help them improve overall performance using the renowned national Baldrige Excellence Framework and leading continuous improvement tools. Baldrige in the U.S.

- U.S. organizations applying for the Baldrige Award have received 1,767 feedback reports detailing organizational strengths and opportunities for improvement.
- 124 Baldrige Award recipients share their role-model practices with other organizations.
- 2010–2020 applicants represent 676,535 U.S. jobs, 5,001 work sites, more than \$189 billion in revenues/budgets, and about 614 million customers served.
- 253 national Baldrige examiners volunteered roughly \$5.7 million in services in 2020.
- In 2019, 29 independently funded and managed regional, state, and sector Baldrige-based programs evaluated 1,598 organizations using 1,686 volunteer examiners.
